Parents want their children to be successful in school. But in some cases, students are met with challenges that to them seem insurmountable. They may act out, shut down, withdraw, or simply stay away from school. For these students, the promise of school success becomes lost on a road filled with negative sanctions. In many ways, they are on the darkest part of a journey in their young lives.

Lutheran Family Services offers school-aged children the opportunity to take a different path. Highly trained educators and treatment specialists help students learn about behavior choices, how to make better decisions, and how to respond to stressful and challenging situations.

Six Minnick Schools help students age 5 to 22 find success in the classroom. We work with public schools in the Harrisonburg, Roanoke, Wytheville, Wise and Bristol regions to help their students achieve academic, behavioral and developmental goals so they may return to their home public school or pursue a path to meaningful work.

Since its beginning in 1888, Lutheran Family Services has evolved from an orphanage in Salem, Virginia, to an agency of 400-strong employees who help create abundant possibilities for individuals through our commonwealth.

#### **Bill Kinard The Promise of Hope**

ISTRY. Combining "Life Tasks" chapter 32 and "Vision Therapy" chapter 34. Combining Life Tasks and Victor Frankl of whom Bill Kinard guotes most often, a brilliant Austrian Psychotherapist and Holocaust Survivor, writes in his book *The Doctor* and the Soul "We must show our patient that the task he is responsible for is always a specific task. It varies from person to person in accord with the uniqueness of each person. It is our business, then, to show how the life of every man has a unique goal to which only one single course leads". The book goes on to prove the role of inner purpose and spiritual values is the role in the conquest of neurosis. Wow, what a mouthful. I challenge Frankl on that. I suppose it is therapeutic to believe our lives have a unique goal and it would be a wonderful thing knowing God has a special, unique plan for my life. I would love that. However, it begs the question of the human condition. Why then all the suffering in this world, for even those who have accepted Christ into their life as God's only Son and their redeemer, confesses sins and asks for forgiveness faces failures, loss, unemployment, greed, etc., We all still sin! But Bill challenges what if Frankl was wrong. What if his time in the prisons of the Holocaust tainted his view? What if God's only plan is to make us better, stronger, and more loving people? It is not a pass to be immoral. It means make better choices. Even if God doesn't have a specific plan for my life, I want, no I need, to find one. I believe, as does Bill, that working toward being a better person, working toward goals in conjunction with the teachings of Christ, is a healthier, more productive way to live. In the chapter Vision Therapy, Bill tells of John Powell who wrote Fully Human, Fully Alive in which his major premise is the way we look at things determines how we feel and react. "John Powell begins Fully Human, Fully Alive with this premise: all change in the quality of a person's life must grow out of a change in his vision of reality. Fundamental is the understanding that emotions grow out of how we see ourselves and out of subjective perceptions and interpretations." Powell suggests that fears, complexes, and negative emotions are traceable to faulty ideas and perceptions, and that to grow and become more fully alive, we must come to terms with irrational unrealistic thinking. OK, I can get behind that but, if we are to change or grow we will have to change our vision or our perception of reality. Powell goes on to state that "Our vision controls the quality of and our participation in human life. Our emotional reactions are not a permanent part of our makeup. Rather, they grow out of the way we see ourselves, other people, life, the world, and God. Our ideas and attitudes about these elements generate our emotional responses. Persistently negative emotions are an indication that there is distortion in our vision and our thinking". Can't you just hear your teenage self-saying "duh"!! What is the vision we need? What will make us whole? We can go online or on our phone and download affirmation apps! We can read selfhelp books; we can go to a therapist; these are all options that may help. Personally, I believe when you decide to make a difference, you decide on a goal and work, I mean you put in the work, its hard I know, you will find meaning and a sense of mission. The more one dedicates oneself to this meaning, the goal, the mission, the more you will develop a sense of profound and personal belonging in this world. My life changed when my frame of reference was Jesus Christ, yes, my college degree gave me career satisfaction and livelihood. Who made me whole? My family of course, and my frame of reference and my journey, was coming to know Christ, not just through attending church and singing in the Choir, getting our kids involved in youth group and through Baptism, Confirmation and becoming a Stephen Minister. No. My affirmation comes

from Jesus' bodily resurrection, for resurrections of hopes and dreams, new life where hope was dead and buried. My faith comes in knowing Christ and accepting him as my Savior. This charges my life with meaning and mission of sharing the good news of Christ. This awakening in my journey, folks, is reaching out to those who are in the dark, those who need faith, grace and mercy. I hope you are finding Bill Kinard's the Promise of Hope, challenging (I am!) and thought provoking. I am sharing this to help cope when life caves in. We join in prayer for the Ministers in our Church, and all of those who are in need. We Stephen Ministers will walk with you and let the Holy Spirit be our guide. May **YOU** through our **Lord Jesus Christ** receive what **God has promised** all of us; grace, mercy, and peace. We pray in your holy name. Amen
